We are a little over 6 months into serving the residents of Mohnton Borough, and I am encouraged to see all of the progress that's been made considering the majority of the Administration, Public Works and Council members are new. We have worked hard to ensure the borough is operating in an efficient manner while being fiscally responsible. Thank you for being patient with us as we tackle new projects and procedures with the goal of making our Borough a clean and safe place to live. We will continuously develop Organizational Excellence principles in every aspect of the boroughs business, LEAN management concepts and strategic goals for the place we all call home.

Some of the key areas we have addressed:

Reed Street Sewer Project—this project will upgrade and fix antiquated infrastructure. It is currently underway and should be completed by 12/1/22. **Playground Entrance Sinkhole**— The large sinkhole is fixed and a new sewer pipe has been installed.

Seasonal Snow Removal and Street Sweeping—This past winter, our residents reported that our snow removal efforts were met with high marks. The street sweeping was done with a hired vendor, this decision was made to greatly reduce the costs associated with this function. Both are incredibly important tasks, striving for clean safe streets is one of our major priorities meant to keep our residents safe.

Grant Projects—our administration is actively pursuing various grant opportunities which will offset the burden to our budget and helping our taxpayers save money. **Events**—Look to our website for new playground events. We encourage our residents to take part, and if possible reach out to us by volunteering to help.

New Mohnton Borough Logo—A new, fresh look and image for the Borough was needed. The design incorporates the nautical feel which reflects the light hearted "Naval Yard" reference used by a lot of our longtime residents. TRASH AND RECYCLING

New Recycling Containers

Recently we distributed new recycling containers to our residents. Thank you Public Works members, Officer Jones who volunteered on his time off, and the Blosenski team for your help!

If you do not want your <u>old container</u>, the old container may be put out on <u>TRASH pickup day which falls on a WEDNESDAY</u>. Please clearly label container: **PLEASE REMOVE.**

These containers have been paid by a D.E.P. grant.

Note: When using the Mohnton playground, please use the recycling and trash receptacles. We have had problems with littering as well as graffiti, this will not be tolerated and violators will be fined.

Yard Waste Recycling Program

Mohnton Borough continues to provide yard waste curbside collection by our Public works crew. Beginning April to the end of September. Every Monday (Tuesday following a holiday) ALL YARD WASTE MUST BE CURBSIDE BY 7:30AM.

Items must be in paper bags or bundled, **no larger than 4 foot lengths.** *Do not use tape to close your bags.* Bags cannot weigh more than 50 lbs. Overweight bags will be left at curbside.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS – Grass/bush clippings, discarded plants, leaves, small branches and twigs. **NO** plastic, glass, or metal.

NO wire or chains are to be used for bundles. During these months, no grass clippings or other yard waste will be allowed in regular trash. Outside of this timeframe all yard waste must be brought to the Borough Hall recycling facility. *Only yard waste in brown paper bags are permitted in the yard waste dumpster.*

Grass and Weed Violation

It is a violation to allow grass and weeds to grow in excess of six inches. Please make sure your property is well maintained and your grass cut to code.

Sidewalks

The constructing and repairing of sidewalks, curbs and driveway entrances along the streets shall be done by the owners of the lot or lots.



Dumpster Permits

Dumpster/POD permits

are required in Mohnton Borough.

Rentals in the Borough

Our Borough requires inspections for rentals. If you are a landlord, please visit the Borough Hall for the correct forms. We will help you with this process.

Feral Cats

A feral cat problem is a hard problem to fix and unfortunately most townships and boroughs have this issue. Feral cats that roam free are mostly not neutered, are known to spread disease, and can prove problematic to your neighborhood. Feral cats anchor to any food source. You can deter these cat colonies by blocking food sources and nesting sites. Keep trash tightly covered, and as hard as it may be, do not feed them. Humane Societies and cat shelters are very familiar with

feral cats and can help in a many ways. Often they will lend special traps that you can use to catch cats in a humane way. These societies should be able to guide you in the rehoming of these cats.
